**Secretary's Report:** Motion by Lion Tom Ludens, seconded by Lion Marlowe Hovey, to approve the minutes of the July meeting; motion approved.

**Treasurer's Report:** Motion by Marlowe, seconded by Lion Robert Wiarda, to approve the Treasurer's report; motion approved.

Her ideas were to do DRHS and SMHS mascots or rock quarry scenes and asked for guidance. Lion Brant DeKruif suggested, to general agreement, that Naomi make the choice herself.
